




Intelligent Automation in Accounts Payable

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Understanding the drawbacks of manual AP processes

Marketing, sales, and human resources. There's a lot that goes into running a business, but **accounts payable (AP)** is an element that shouldn't be overlooked.

In many companies, AP processes are still largely paperintensive. Incoming invoices are manually validated, entered into a database, stored in filing cabinets, and processed for payment. Paper invoices also tend to get lost in a mess of folders and filing cabinets, so it takes longer to retrieve, verify, and reconcile accounts.

What is intelligent automation?

To define intelligent automation, it's important to understand one of its core components: robotic process automation (RPA). **RPA is a technology designed to minimize human intervention in repetitive tasks.** In other words, it mimics how a person would use conventional computer applications.

With RPA, users can eliminate manual data entry. However, RPA tools merely repeat the functions and actions that they were programmed to do. This form of automation can be useful, but it can't make automated and intelligent decisions that are often required when processing invoices.

Intelligent automation fixes the shortcomings of RPA tools with artificial intelligence (AI). It assists workers by taking care of routine tasks while adapting and making decisions on the spot. In the context of AP, intelligent automation can decide the next course of action based on the data. It can route newly captured invoices to certain AP staff and keep track of payment deadlines.

Another important component of intelligent automation is integration. By integrating document management system (DMS) and enterprise resource planning (ERP), intelligent automation tools can speed up the workflows involved with capturing, validating, and approving supplier invoices.



Driving business value with intelligent AP automation

When intelligent automation is fully incorporated into AP processes, invoicing and billing tasks are a breeze. Imagine never worrying about payment deadlines or bottlenecks that may occur due to an influx of last minute invoices. And these perks are just the tip of the iceberg. Intelligent **AP automation offers a host of benefits to your business.**



◊ Enhance employee experience

As mentioned, manual invoicing is tedious work. Employees have to open various documents, extract information, and key it into the company's ERP system. Such processes are inefficient, error-prone, and wasteful of employees' time.

Most AP staff can't focus on big-picture tasks like optimizing cash flow and fraud prevention when they're constantly bogged down by manual work. They're also more likely to feel miserable and unsatisfied with their jobs since they're forced to do repetitive, mind-numbing work every day. This bleeds into their overall performance and often leads to more mistakes down the line.

Intelligent AP automation frees up your employees from these repetitive tasks. When invoices arrive via fax, post, or email, employees can capture them using DMS solutions like PaperSave. These apps use an AIpowered feature called optical character recognition



(OCR), which converts captured documents into machine-readable information. From there, AP automation tools instantly upload the information to your accounting database and triggers a set of preprogrammed workflows.

For example, you can have a workflow that forwards invoices above \$10,000 to an approval manager that's authorized to deal with large transactions. You can even teach automation tools to validate bill accuracy and follow up with vendors if discrepancies between price and units received are detected.

Automating these processes dramatically reduces your AP department's workload. Instead of spending countless hours doing boring paperwork, AP staff can devote more of their time on strategic tasks that require a human touch. Plus, when staff are delegated to more tasks, job satisfaction and productivity levels tend to get a serious boost.





Optimize cash flow

Intelligent AP automation provides many opportunities to optimize your cash flow. For starters, because automation minimizes human involvement, invoice processing costs drop by a significant margin. According to early reports, companies that switched from manual to automated processes save up to 75% per invoice.

AP automation lets you schedule payments and set alerts for when an outstanding invoice is close to the deadline. This is particularly useful for avoiding late payment fees and a great way to systematically meet early payment discounts. Suppliers are often willing to negotiate more flexible payment terms when you pay invoices on time and stay on their good side, contributing to a positive cash flow.

If taught to do so, intelligent automation tools can track supplier information and evaluate longstanding payment terms to ensure they're not hindering cash flow.

Finally, AP automation keeps detailed records of business transactions in your ERP dashboard. You can then access this information to forecast your cash flow and plan for future payments accordingly. You can even program automation tools to adapt to these forecasts and know when is the optimal time to hold on to cash or spend it.

Businesses can save 75% or more when they automate their accounts payable processes — spending approximately \$5 per invoice vs. \$20 doing it manually.

Intelligent automation tools automatically index and organize files in a company's DMS platform, so all employees have to do is type a few keywords in a search bar to retrieve certain files in a flash.

By the numbers: how much will you save?

Let's make all of this information crystal clear by examining what it might look like in the real world. Imagine a modestsized retailer tucked away in a suburb just outside of a big city. The shop keeps its shelves stocked by issuing around 250 purchase orders per month to approximately 50 different suppliers.

It's a messy clipboard-and-paper affair organized by a manager making roughly \$50,000 per year. If our imaginary retailer is anything like the average company, all the invoicing costs — from labor to storage — add up to about \$10 per purchase order. That equals \$30,000 per year spent on invoicing.

One night, the shop manager sees a news segment on business process automation and does some research. She finds a simple app that costs around \$50 per user per month to maintain. Since it eliminates most of the data entry, mistakes, and storage needs, her productivity jumps up by 80% and the cost per purchase order (PO) drops to around \$2.50.


That means the annual cost to process invoices drops by \$22,500 — that's as much as hiring a new cashier! The business process automation app pays for itself within the first month.
